What is Title I?

Richmond Heights Local Schools is identified as a Title I Schoolwide Program as part of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards and reinforcing and enhancing efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop, with all parents, a written family engagement plan.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Richmond Heights Local Schools will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Richmond Heights Local Schools values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Richmond Heights Local Schools will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

RHLSD invited all parents to attend the Title Parent information night in October to review and revise this family engagement plan, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online survey form. The plan is posted on our school Web site for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by sending it home to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. RHLSD will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children, and parents of homeless students.

Where is it available?

The plan will also be posted on the school Web site. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in each school building and the board of education.

2017–18 District Goals

- To decrease the number of students in the lower ELA performance levels, and increase the number of students in proficient and accelerated ELA performance levels.
- To decrease the number of students in the lower Math performance levels, and increase the number of students in proficient and accelerated Math performance levels.

2017–18 School Goals

- To analyze data to identify causes for areas of concern.
- To move 10% of students from Limited, Basic, or Proficient to the next level in ELA.
- To move 10% of students from Limited, Basic, or Proficient to the next level in Math.
- To continue implementation of PBIS.
- To have 100% of teachers using current, instructional technology to support the core curriculum.
- To increase family contacts, and to encourage participation in Family Engagement activities.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, RHLSD and our families have developed a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts are reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the school year. The school-parent compacts are kept with each child's teacher and at the board of education if parents need a copy.
